## Perceptions of Breastfeeding and Pumping in Public

Survey results from a 2019 poll of more than 1,000 Americans point to a lack of support and acceptance for women nursing or pumping in public spaces.

25% men and 22% women find breastfeeding and pumping in public inappropriate.

20% of men do not believe public spaces should provide a lactation room, which is significantly more than the 7% of women who believe the same.

More than 21% men do not think employers should be required to allow breaks during the work day for new moms to pump, compared to just 9% of women.

An overwhelming 41% of men do not believe employers should be required to provide a lactation room for breast pumping, and a concerning 23% of women feel the same.

46% of men and about 24% of women do not think employers with unconventional workplaces (police officers, firefighters, teachers, construction, etc.) should be required to have a lactation room.
